#### **Assist**

A pass that directly contributes to a goal.

"Her assist set up the winning play."

#### **Bench**

The area where substitute players and coaches sit during the game.

"The coach signaled from the bench."

## **Breakaway**

A situation where an offensive player is free of defenders for a scoring chance.

"The breakaway led to a spectacular goal."

## Check

A defensive maneuver to impede an opponent's progress.

"He delivered a clean check to stop the advance."

#### Deke

A feint or fake move used to beat a defender.

"He used a clever deke to get past his opponent."

#### **Faceoff**

The method of starting play by dropping the puck between two opposing players.

"The referee initiated a faceoff at center ice."

#### Goal

The target area guarded by the goalie where points are scored.

"A powerful shot sent the puck into the goal."

#### Goalie

The player responsible for defending the goal against scoring attempts.

"The goalie made several spectacular saves."

#### Hat-trick

Scoring three goals in a single game by one player.

"He celebrated his hat-trick with his teammates."

## lcing

A rule violation when the puck is shot from behind the center line past the opponent's red line without being touched.

"The play was stopped due to icing."

#### Offside

A violation occurring when players are in an illegal position relative to the puck and opponents.

"The referee called offside on the attacking player."

## **Penalty**

A punishment imposed for breaking the rules during the game.

"He received a penalty for tripping."

## **Penalty shot**

A one-on-one scoring opportunity awarded after certain penalties.

"The penalty shot provided a chance for redemption."

## **Power play**

A situation in which one team has a numerical advantage due to penalties on the opponent.

"The team capitalized on the power play to score."

#### **Puck**

The small, hard disc used as the object in hockey games.

"The player slid the puck across the ice."

#### Rink

The enclosed ice surface on which the game is played.

"The team met at the rink for practice."

#### **Skate**

The specialized footwear with blades that allow players to glide on the ice.

"Her new skates made her feel fast on the rink."

## Slap shot

A hard, full-windup shot that is taken to score a goal.

"The player's slapshot was one of the fastest in the league."

#### Stick

The equipment used by players to hit, pass, and control the puck.

"He skillfully handled his stick during the game."

## Wraparound

A move in which the puck is passed around the net quickly.

"The player executed a wraparound to surprise the goalie."
