# Unit 18 — English for Rugby

A rule allowing play to continue after an infringement if beneficial to the non-offending team. "The referee called advantage after the offense prevailed."

## Back

A player in the backline, typically responsible for running and scoring. "The back dashed past the defense."

## Breakdown

The phase immediately following a tackle when the ball is contested on the ground. "A chaotic breakdown ensued after the tackle."

## Conversion

A kick attempted after a try to earn extra points. "The conversion kick sailed through the posts."

## Drop goal

A scoring method where the ball is dropped and kicked as it bounces. "She scored a drop goal from distance."

## Dummy

A deceptive move meant to mislead the defense. "He performed a dummy to bypass the tackle."

## Flanker

A forward known for agility and tackling, supporting both attack and defense. "The flanker made crucial tackles."

## Forward

A player positioned in the pack, involved in physical contests.

"The forwards dominated the scrum."

## Hooker

A forward who plays in the middle of the scrum and hooks the ball.

"The hooker ensured possession in the scrum."

#### Kick

A method of passing or gaining territory by striking the ball with the foot. "He executed a long kick downfield."

#### Lineout

A method to restart play when the ball goes out, where players are lifted to catch it. "They executed a perfect lineout."

## Lock

A key forward who provides height and power in lineouts and scrums. "The lock dominated the lineout."

#### Maul

A phase where the ball carrier is held up by opponents and teammates bind around him. "The maul advanced steadily down the field."

## Offload

A pass made in the process of being tackled to continue the play. "A quick offload kept the attack alive."

## Penalty

A punishment for rule infringements, often resulting in a kick. "A penalty was awarded for a foul."

## Ruck

A contest for the ball on the ground following a tackle.

"A hard ruck formed after the collision."

## Scrum

A formation where forwards pack together to restart play. "The teams locked in a fierce scrum."

## Tackle

The act of stopping an opponent by bringing them to the ground. "A solid tackle ended the opponent's run."

## Try

A score achieved when a player grounds the ball in the opponent's in-goal area. "He scored a try after a strong break."

## Wing

A player positioned on the side of the field known for speed.

"The wing sprinted down the sideline."
